End of Key Stage Results – 2024-2025

- Academic achievement is progressive i.e. we would expect that the results for Key Stage 2 would show a cumulative improvement on the results in Key Stage 1 as each child moves through their educational journey with us.
- A variety of internal assessments alongside standardised external assessments are used to inform teaching and learning. These assessments are intended to facilitate academic progress and the evaluation of that progress against relevant national norms.
- Our year groups are small and one child can represent a significant proportion of the cohort.
- BPS is not academically selective on entry and each cohort has a range of academic ability and neuro diversities represented. We are proud that our results compare favourably with academically selective schools, and each child is supported and challenged to succeed.
- Children at BPS do not sit the SATs assessments but the assessments that we use are comparable.
